presentation

With this edition of Andalusia Basic Data 2001, the Institute of Statistics of Andalusia brings out, after eight years in a row, one of the repertoires of statistical information that have achieved a better reception and a bigger dissemination among the increasing number of statistical users that demand data in our region.

Since its creation in 1994 until this emblematic first year of the XXI century, Andalusia Basic Data has been responding to both a necessity and an ambition: to offer a quick source of enquiry, easy to use and strongly informative, to the citizens and that permits them to approach the more relevant data of our reality.

Organised in 17 thematic chapters, in which more than 120 tables and graphics have been included, Andalusia Basic Data 2001 incorporates into the different statistical sources information related to the origin of the data, methodological explanations and useful comments centred around the concepts and variables that have been used in its drawing up. In the same way, in order to facilitate the increase of information to every user who wishes so, it has been included in each chapter a relation of additional sources of enquiry. All this has been completed together with the interest of improving the flow of information about Andalusia, from the objectivity and the rigour.

Among the novelties that has been incorporated into the present edition of Andalusia Basic Data, it is worth highlighting, in the Chapter 1 "Territory and environment", the inclusion of information related to the water balance of the basins and the demand of water per use. In the Chapter 3, about "Education and occupational training", it is presented, for the very first time, figures concerning the awarded scholarships and grants disaggregated per provinces and number of graduates per university and branch. In the Chapter 17, about "Great figures of the Andalusian economy", it has been incorporated information from the Annual Regional Accounting of Andalusia. Finally, it has been opted for dividing into two individual and separate chapters the information related to the spheres of "Culture" and "Leisure time".

Edited in paper support, Andalusia Basic Data 2001 is likewise accessible through the web of the Institute of Statistics of Andalusia (www.iea.junta-andalucia.es). In there, in addition to a considerable volume of statistical sources, it is facilitated the access to previous editions of this work, as well as the possibility of communicating with the Institute in order to make suggestions or ask for more detailed information.

We hope that this eighth printing of Andalusia Basic Data enjoys the excellent reception that precedent editions received. It will be another proof of the contribution that statistics make for illuminating the knowledge on Andalusia and facilitating its comprehension. And it will be, more than any other thing, the unmistakable proof that, year after year, the passion for the present and the future of Andalusia is being shaping as an inseparable partner of the passion for unravelling its keys.
